*In recent years scientific studies have demonstrated that student and teacher 'mindsets' have a profound impact on learning. Students with a 'growth mindset' (Dweck, 2006) who believe that intelligence and 'smartness' can be learned and that the brain can grow from exercise learn more effectively, displaying a desire for challenge and showing resilience in the face of failure. Such behaviors encourage greater math persistence, engagement and high achievement.*

Bio: Dr. Jo Boaler is a Professor of Mathematics Education at Stanford University and co-founder of [youcubed.org](http://youcubed.org). Former roles have included being the Marie Curie Professor of Mathematics Education for England, a mathematics teacher in London comprehensive schools and a lecturer and researcher at King's College, London. She is the author of eight books including "The Elephant in the Classroom" (2015) and "Mathematical Mindsets" (2016). She is the recipient of the Presidential National Science Foundation Award and the NCSM award for equity. She is also the author of the first MOOC on mathematics learning for teachers and parents, a White House presenter and an advisor to several Silicon Valley firms.
